# Our animals and you

You can look at the animals, but you must not touch them.

You may find yourself inside some of our animals' homes (walk-through exhibits). Please stay quiet, calm and at least 1 meter away from the animals.

Remember that our animals maybe scared of loud noises, so please do not bang on the windows or shout at them.





# Who lives at the Zoo

Sumatran tigers live in Tiger Territory.

Western lowland gorillas live in Gorilla Kingdom.

Asiatic lions live in Land of the Lions.





# Who lives at the Zoo

Humboldt penguins live at Penguin Beach.



# Who lives at the Zoo

Some of the animals will be big, like this giraffe.



Some of the animals will be very small, like this mantis!

# Who lives at the Zoo

- Some of the animal homes are inside and very warm (see top left picture of Rainforest Life).
- Other animal homes are outside (see bottom left picture of Penguin Beach).
- In some animal homes you can walk next to the animals (see right-hand middle picture).
- There might be some unusual smells as you walk around because animals smell very different from humans.
- Sometimes the animals make noises.





# Things to see at the Zoo

- The keeper uses a microphone so that everyone can hear at our talks or demonstrations.
- The animals may come close but will not touch you at the demonstration.





# Events: Poo at the Zoo

- On entry into the Zoo, you will see this sign (top) to the right of the what's on board. Follow the arrow to find the event activities.
- When you go past the entrance to Tiger Territory you will see this sign (bottom). You are close to the event hub now.





# Events: Poo at the Zoo



When you get to the event hub you will see the programme for the day.



Go through the giant inflatable poo tunnel to get into the event hub.

# Events: Poo at the Zoo



At our poo help desk, you can collect your starting sticker for the trail. If you didn't get a trail card at the main entrance, you can collect one here too. Remember to come back here and collect your 'Qualified Poolologist' stamp once you have finished the trail.

Also at the event hub is our main stage. Here you can go to a stage show of the Poo in the Zoo book or come along to a bubble and music party (see the programme for times).

On the opposite lawn is our Pooseum where you can see a collection of real animal poo!





# Events: Poo at the Zoo

At each of the trail locations there will be a trail board.

These can be found at the following animal exhibits:

- Land of the Lions (lions)
- Tiger Territory (tigers)
- Penguin Beach (penguins)
- Giants of the Galapagos (Galapagos tortoises)
- Secret Life of Reptiles and Amphibians (snakes)
- Blackburn Pavilion (birds)



# Other places at the Zoo

There are lots of places where you can buy food if you are hungry.

Sit by a tree on one of the lawns or explore the wildlife garden by Land of the Lions.
